The Children's Society




# The following extract was kindly sent to me from Sally who

Our village historian writes something for the Diary every month and the November issue carried the picture of the William Morris window that was installed in 1923. As you will see, a few days later I was visiting relatives and for some unknown reason the connection between Langton Green and Doddington churches was mentioned.
